Beetle Mania: Sunday Afternoon with a Scientist at the State Museum - "Beetle Mania" took over Morrill Hall at the University of Nebraska State Museum August 15 for a presentation for children and families that celebrates the beauty and diversity of beetles and other insects. Visitors had the opportunity to interact with scientists and ask questions about the insects they collect and study from across the globe for purposes of education and biodiversity research. Some children brought their small collection or a "backyard bug" for a scientist to identify. This program was part of the Museum's monthly Sunday with a Scientist series. "Beetle Mania" was led by **Dr. Brett Ratcliffe** (Curator of the Museum's Entomology Research Collections); **Dr. Matthew Paulsen** (Entomology Collections Manager); **Dr. Mary Liz Jameson** (Wichita State University) and her graduate student, **Matt Moore**; **Steve Spomer** (Research Technician, UNL Department of Entomology); and UNL entomology graduate students, **Jesús Orozco** and **Ken Miwa**.

Exhibited were a small selection of the most colorful and striking beetles and other insects from all over the world. Included were large tropical rhinoceros beetles (part of a large National Science Foundation funded project to document rhinoceros beetle diversity in Mexico and Guatemala), metallic wood boring beetles, longhorn beetles, stag beetles, and minute rove beetles. Other insects on display included giant silk moths, metallic blue morpho butterflies, giant spiders, and even insect candy. Specialty exhibits included live insects, insect musicians, and Nebraska's endangered Salt Creek tiger beetle and American burying beetle. Dr. Tom Hunt and **Silvana Moraes** organized and participated in a Round Table Symposia at the Brazilian Entomology Congress in Natal, Brazil entitled "IPM in the Age of Transgenic Crops: Are IPM and Transgenic Technology Compatible or in Conflict?" on September 28. The following week they visited Embrapa Cerrados, Brasilia, where they discussed various pest management topics, and the University of Brasilia, where they made presentations on the role of Bt corn in IPM, and lepidopteran larval survival and implications for pest management.

Dr. Bob Wright participated in a meeting as the Entomological Society of America representative to the Advisory Committee for IPM Voice (<http://ipmvoice.org>) on October 4, in Alexandria, VA.
