Our 2006-2007 Scholarship Winners



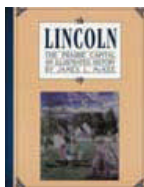
