What do PSEs do?

- Learn about sexuality and sexual health information & issues.
- Encourage people to access the information they need and learn skills required to have consensual, healthy & informed relationships.
- Learn to provide accurate, comprehensive, & current information in an inclusive & nonjudgmental manner; and learn job-related skills.
- Provide sexual health information and promotion about a variety of topics: Contraception; STIs, HIV/AIDS; Safer Sex, Healthy Relationships; Sexual Health....
- Help with campus-wide programming that address a variety of topics and issues such as Love Your Body Day and World AIDS Day.
- Provide HIV antibody Testing Site at the University Health Center, Rm. 164 as well as additional outreach testing at times.

What else?

- PSEs are paid a stipend for providing presentations and staffing booths.
- PSEs also donate their time to learn information, attend meetings, and assist with the planning, implementation, and participation in other programming and events. PSEs are leaders on campus who perform a worthwhile service to the UNL campus and Lincoln community.

What training do PSEs receive?

First year PSEs take NUTR230 (section 004), which meets on Mondays in the Spring from 2 – 3 pm. Attendance is also required at weekly meetings, Orientation (at the beginning of each academic year) & other training sessions which are scheduled outside of class & meeting times. Meetings are held weekly during the fall and spring semesters on Mondays from 3:15 – 4:15 pm. PSEs providing HIV testing must complete an additional 2-day workshop.

PSE Requirements & Qualifications

- Be enrolled as a UNL student and successfully complete NUTR230
- Commit to the program for the following academic year
- Attend all scheduled meetings, trainings, and designated activities
- Actively participate in sexual health programming
- Assist in PSE recruitment for the following year
- Be interested in sexual health education & issues
- Have a willingness and ability to present educational programs and assist in programming in an inclusive, accurate, and nonjudgmental manner
- Have or develop effective communication skills
