Spring and Summer	Develop proposal and pursue inquiries and contacts abroad.
Late August	Contact Dr. Stoddard or Dr. Laura Damuth with any questions you have regarding your proposal, application or time line for applications.
September	Deadline for application turned into UNL Fulbright Office. Precise deadline date will be available in August 2008
October	Deadline for submitting revised applications to Fulbright Office Precise deadline date will be available in August 2008
Late January 2009	Expect notification of "recommended" candidates
May or June 2009	Expect notification of Fulbright Grant
Fall 2009	Commence year of study abroad

Eligibility

Have a Bachelor's degree before date of grant (i.e. mid-2009, but not a Ph.D
(with some exceptions)
U.S. Citizen (at time of application)
No previous Fulbright grant during last 3 years
Enrolled at, or recently graduated from UNL
Prepared to do graduate work by mid-to-late 2009

Application Procedures

Prepare a proposal of graduate study in a specific country (except for a few
Teaching Assistantships)
Obtain a statement of foreign language proficiency (except for English)
Complete preliminary application by mid-September
