Time line for UNL Students to follow for 2009:

February / March	Dr. Laura Damuth (ldamuth1@unl.edu) to discuss your ideas about a topic and a possible host country.
Early May	Obtain booklets and application forms from UNL Fulbright Office (International Affairs, 420 University Terrace) or online with Fulbright (www.iie.org/fulbright) The online application opens on May 1.
Spring and Summer	Develop proposal and pursue inquiries and contacts abroad.
Late August	Contact Dr. Laura Damuth with any questions you have regarding your proposal, application or time line for applications.
September 11th	Deadline for application turned into UNL Fulbright Office. Precise deadline date will be available in August 2009
October	Deadline for submitting revised applications to Fulbright Office Precise deadline date will be available in August 2009
Late January 2010	Expect notification of "recommended" candidates
May or June 2010	Expect notification of Fulbright Grant
Fall 2010	Commence year of study abroad

Books and research allowance
Round-trip transportation to host country
Supplemental health and accident insurance
Partial support for dependents (a few countries)

Eligibility

Have a Bachelor's degree before date of grant (i.e. mid-2010 but not a Ph.D
(with some exceptions)
U.S. Citizen (at time of application)
No previous Fulbright grant during last 3 years
Enrolled at, or recently graduated from UNL
Prepared to do graduate work by mid-to-late 2010

Application Procedures

Prepare a proposal of graduate study in a specific country (except for a few
Teaching Assistantships)
Obtain a statement of foreign language proficiency (except for English)
Complete preliminary application by mid-September
