International Studies Program Scholarship

This scholarship subsidizes expenses accompanied with involvement in a foreign study program. One or more grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$2,500 are available to undergraduates and/or graduates attending the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Qualifications:

1. Read, write, and speak a foreign language at a level that allows full pursuit for study or research abroad,
2. Cumulative GPA of 3.0
3. Have completed at least 42 semester hours of undergraduate coursework
4. Have worked to provide at least 10% of the cost of his/her college education.



Deadline: February 1

Funds are dispersed over one year.
For study abroad the following summer, fall,
spring semester or academic year.



Edythe Ann Wiebers spent much of her life studying, traveling, and working abroad. During her junior year at UNL she studied at Regensburg University in Germany. She graduated with a B.A. degree in psychology and German from UNL in 1981. In 1983, she studied at the Albert-Ludwig University in Freiburg, Germany. She got married in Hong Kong in 1990 and subsequently lived and worked in Xi'an, Shanghai and Beijing, the People's Republic of China, where she learned to speak Chinese. In June 1996, Edye was diagnosed with cancer; she died March 13, 1998 at her home in Lincoln at age 40.



Application Form Edythe Wiebers International Studies Program Scholarship

The purpose of the Edythe Wiebers International Studies Program Scholarship is to subsidize expenses accompanied with involvement in a foreign study program. One or more grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$2,500 are available to undergraduates and/or graduates attending the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. To be eligible, a student must (1) read, write, and speak a foreign language at a level that allows full pursuit of the proposed course of study or research abroad, (2) have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above for all college or university courses taken, (3) have completed at least 42 semester hours toward a baccalaureate degree, and (4) have worked to provide at least 10% of the cost of the student's college education from his or her own resources. Grant recipients will be required to submit a mid-term report of 800 words or less describing the progress they have made in meeting the intellectual goals set forth in their Statement of Purpose. In addition, they will be required to give an informal lecture at UNL on a topic related to their field of study or research.

To be considered, complete the following application form and submit it to the College of Business Administration Dean's Office for Undergraduate Programs, 138 College of Business, with the required documentation by February 1.

For undergraduates:

1. A Statement of Purpose of no more than 700 words describing the academic and/or intellectual goals you hope to attain through the proposed course of study or research.
2. A letter of confirmation from a UNL faculty member or placement information from the Department of Modern Languages indicating your language proficiency.
3. If the foreign study program in which you are interested is not offered through UNL, a letter from an appropriate authority at your College (advisor or dean) that credits from the foreign study program in question will be applicable towards a degree at UNL.
4. Transcripts of all work taken at an institution of higher education and your current semester schedule.

For graduate students:

1. A Statement of Purpose of no more than 700 words describing the foreign advanced study course you wish to undertake and explaining how this advanced study course is related to your study for a graduate degree.
2. Evidence of the language proficiency noted above.
3. Evidence that you have been accepted into/applied to a foreign study program offered by UNL or approved by UNL. Contact International Affairs for procedures to obtain approval for non-UNL programs. The candidate must also make known to the Selection Committee all the conditions upon which admission by the foreign institution/study abroad program is offered, including academic and financial requirements.
4. Transcripts of all work taken at an institution of higher education.
