Alan L. Berger occupies the Raddock Family Eminent Scholar Chair for Holocaust Studies at Florida Atlantic University where he also directs the Center for the Study of Values and Violence after Auschwitz. Among his books are *Crisis and Covenant: The Holocaust in American Jewish Fiction*, *Judaism in the Modern World* (Editor), and *Children of Job: American Second-Generation Witnesses to the Holocaust*, (Foreword by Elie Wiesel). He has lectured on the Holocaust, Jewish American Literature, Theology, and Christian/Jewish Relations throughout America and in Europe, Australia, South Africa, and Israel. Professor Berger has also spoken at the Center for Advanced Holocaust Studies at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. Currently he is editor of the new series "Studies in Genocide: Religion, History and Human Rights" for Rowman and Littlefield. Berger was awarded the Degree of Doctor of Letters *Honoris Causa* from Luther College in 1999.
