## Jewish Art & Jewish History

**Ezra Mendelsohn** will address how images created by both Jews and non-Jews can cast light on major issues in modern Jewish history. These issues include nationalism, identity, acculturation and assimilation, and relations between Jews and non-Jews.

Mendelsohn is professor in the Institute of Contemporary Jewry, and in Russian and East European Studies, at Hebrew University, Jerusalem. He holds a doctorate degree from Columbia University and is widely published in the field of Jewish history and culture, especially pertaining to the 20<sup>th</sup> century.
