

# Summer Graduate Assistantships

<b>Positions</b>	Summer Graduate Teaching Assistantships in Music
<b>Responsibilities</b>	Duties include, but are not limited to, 10 hours per week for 5 weeks assisting with summer courses, computer labs, library research, and/or workshops.
<b>Qualifications</b>	Applicants must be accepted into a music graduate program at the University of Nebraska–Lincoln and must be registered for classes in the summer session in which they are receiving GTA assistance. Preference will be given to Master of Music Option II (music education) degree candidates who are working toward degree requirements by attending Summer Sessions.
<b>Stipend</b>	Remuneration includes a salary of approximately \$600 - \$700.
<b>Starting Date</b>	June 9, 2008

## School of Music

The University of Nebraska–Lincoln, with a student body of 22,000, offers all levels of study from undergraduate to doctoral programs. A minimum of 30-36 semester hours is required for completion of the Master of Music degree which includes the following areas of emphasis: Music Education, Conducting, Performance, Composition, Musicology, Woodwind Specialist, and Piano Pedagogy. A Ph.D. degree is available in Music Education, and a DMA degree is offered in Performance, Conducting, and Composition. The School of Music has 400 majors, over 40 faculty members, and 50 graduate assistants. Located adjacent to the nationally recognized Lied Center for Performing Arts, School of Music facilities include two recital halls, three large ensemble rooms, the Westbrook Music Library, and sophisticated curriculum/computer labs for music applications.
