SUSAN ROSOWSKI PROFESSORSHIPS

Call for Applications and Nominations

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln has established a new Susan Rosowski Professorship to recognize faculty members at the associate professor level who have achieved a distinguished record of scholarship or creative activity and who show exceptional promise for future excellence. The professorships are established under the following rules:

1. A limited number of these Susan Rosowski Professorships may be awarded in any given year. Faculty members holding these professorships will be designated as "Susan Rosowski Professor of [field]."
2. Any UNL tenured associate professor, regardless of discipline, who does not currently hold another named professorship or chair, is eligible to be nominated or apply. A faculty member may not hold a Susan Rosowski Professorship and another named professorship or chair simultaneously.
3. Susan Rosowski Professors will be appointed for one 5-year term.
4. Susan Rosowski Professors will receive a \$3,000 annual stipend.
5. Selection for a Susan Rosowski Professorship will be made on the basis of a demonstrated record of distinguished scholarship or creative activity, and on the basis of evidence that the individual will continue to perform at an exemplary level. Nominations and applications will be reviewed by the Committee on University Professorships. Final selections will be made by the Chancellor.



Nomination and Application Procedure:

Nominations and supporting materials should be submitted electronically to svcaaoffice@unlnotes.unl.edu by October 2, 2009.

The completed dossier should include:

- A letter of nomination or application
- A current curriculum vitae
- The names, addresses, and telephone numbers of two appropriate scholars of national prominence not associated with the University of Nebraska who will serve as references. (Letters of reference will be solicited by the Office of the Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs.)

The candidate should also arrange to have his or her department chair or head provide a letter of support; the letter should first be forwarded to the dean to add his or her endorsement, and the dean should then send it to the Office of the Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs. Letters of nomination or application, references, and support should describe and explain the significance and quality of the individual's record of distinguished scholarship or creative activity and expectations for continued excellence.

The Office of the Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs is available to provide advice on the best way to assemble a file for consideration.
