MATH 100A, Intermediate Algebra (3 Credit Hrs; may not apply toward total graduation hours)
Math 100A is designed for students who have completed Math 95C or one year of high school algebra. The SSS section meets five days per week instead of the standard three days, enabling students to receive extra classroom instruction.

MATH 101, College Algebra (3 Credit Hrs)

Math 101 is open to students who have completed Math 100A at UNL or have received the prerequisite score on the Math Placement Exam. The SSS section meets five days per week instead of the usual three days, making it especially valuable for students who may need additional help.

Section 171: 9:30-10:20 AM MTWRF CBA 105

ENGLISH 151, Writing: Rhetoric as Argument (3 Credit Hrs)

This is a first-year English composition course that engages students in the study of written argument: developing an informed and committed stance on a topic, and using writing to share this stance with particular audiences for particular purposes. Students can expect to produce the equivalent of 25 double-spaced pages of polished prose (a minimum of three writing projects) during the semester. This course is recommended for students who wish to improve their writing and reading skills through the study and practice of argument.

Section 260: 10:30-11:20 AM MWF AND 24

EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY 150 Career Development Seminar (2 Credit Hrs)

Students explore career options and develop skills to recognize how jobs, occupations and careers are related to one's interests, needs, skills and opportunities. The course is especially helpful for students who have not selected or are changing their major.

EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY 327 Human Relation in Higher Education (3 Credit Hrs)

This course encourages self-exploration and the development of academic skills to promote students' success in higher educations.

BIOLOGY 101, General Biology (3 Credit Hrs)

Prerequisite: Students are required to take Biology 101 Lab (B101L).

This course covers major concepts and processes common to all organisms. Typical topics of study will include chemistry, genetics, ecology, cell and molecular functioning, energy transfer, development, heredity, evolution and the diversity of life. The primary goals of General Biology are to provide the student with an understanding of: (1) major biological principles that guide the activities of living things, and (2) the methods biologists use to gain new information. This course will demonstrate to the student that the field of biological sciences is dynamic, exciting and makes important contributions to society, and is worthy of their future study's. Students must attend 5 one-hour lectures each week. The lecture grade will be based on hour exams and a final exam.
