## \$50 Provides...

- 200 organ donor program brochures to educate the public about organ donation and the success of organ transplantation.
- A picnic lunch in the park for 13 elderly citizens requiring assisted care.
- Enough art materials to provide two weeks of fun and creative activities in the Museum's Artist's Studio.

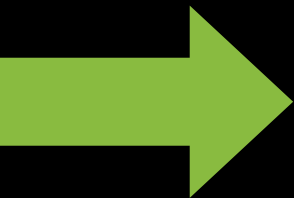
