The deadline for receipt of all abstracts is Monday, November 30, 2009 at 5:00pm EST. Unless noted otherwise, only proposals submitted through this website will be considered. Submitters should receive

a system-generated e-mail confirmation of their submission within 24 hours. If this confirmation does not arrive, submitters should log back on to the site to verify that their proposal was accepted correctly in the system.

We particularly encourage the submission of proposals by professionals working in the commercial sector. Please feel free to contact the conference chair with ideas that may depart from the normal conference paper format.

Final decisions about the program will be made by the end of January 2010. If your proposal is accepted, we will expect the text of the full paper by April 12, 2010.
