Come join us for lunch with Professor Virginia Braun, a psychologist from the University of Auckland who specializes in women's health, gendered bodies, and sexuality. In this informal brownbag exchange Braun will describe her latest project in which she investigates the prevalence of sexual coercion among gay and bisexual men -- an experience which, she argues, is more widespread than its silence suggests. She will then address the wider contextual and sociological factors at work and will also highlight the larger questions this project raises.

Virginia Braun will also give a lecture Tuesday afternoon at 3:30pm in the Nebraska Union. The title of the presentation is "Questioning 'The Designer Vagina': A Critical Analysis of Female Genital Cosmetic Discourse and Practice."
