

DUNDY COUNTY, NEBRASKA

(It) lies in the southwestern part of the state bordering the states of Kansas and Colorado. Benkleman is the county seat. The land in the northern part is level, but elsewhere rolling. The soil where it is level is better, therefore more productive although quite sandy, in fact, most of the county is sand. Well water near the Republican River and in the valleys is slightly alkaline, not very tasteful. In the higher elevation, the depth of the water is from 100 to 250 feet, but the water is good tasting and healthful. There are only six Czech families in the county. This is about all I could learn here in my search.
